

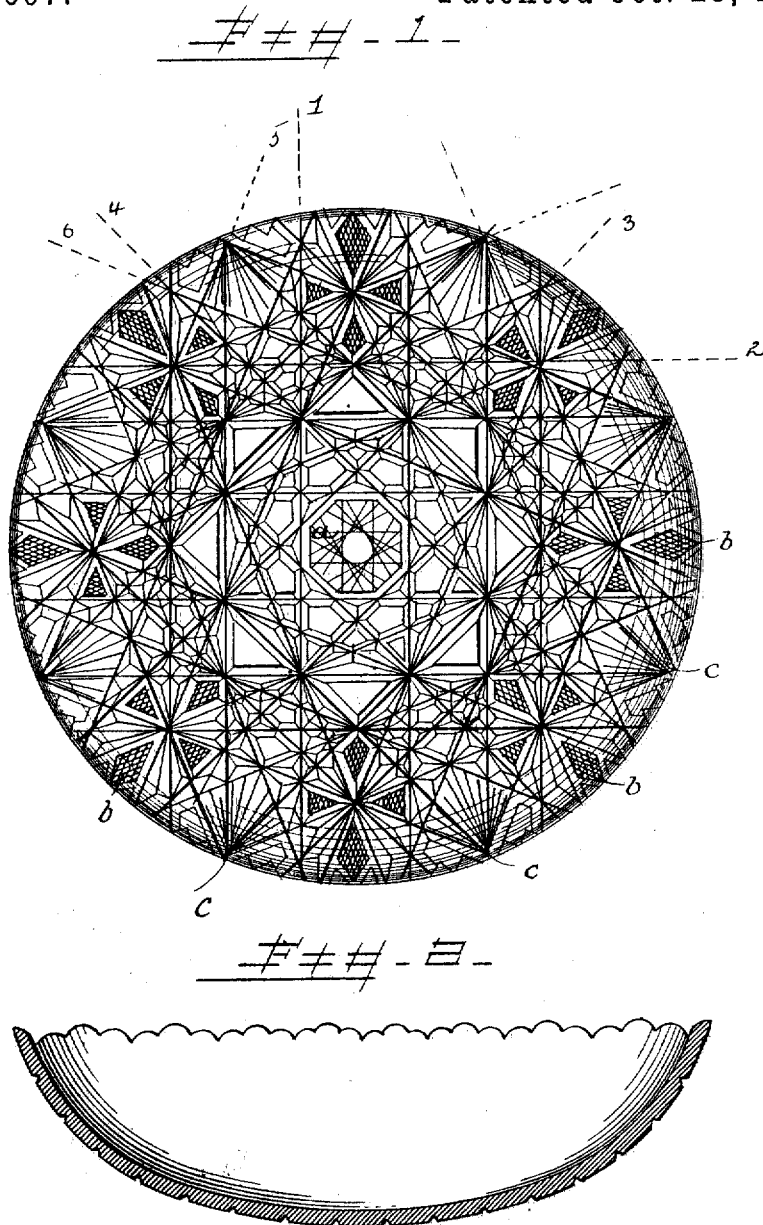

## DESIGN FOR A DISH.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 18,697, dated October 23, 1888.

Application filed March 13, 1888. Serial No. 267,121. Term of patent 7 years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JOSEPH B. HILL, a subject of the Queen of Great Britain, residing at Philipsburg, Beaver county, Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and useful Design for a Glass Dish; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form part of this specification.

This design has relation to glass vessels, particularly the shallow corners convex vessels or bowls known as "nappies."

The design is for the ornamentation and shape of the exterior surface or under side of the vessel, which is covered by several series of practically straight lines or grooves running from edge to edge. There are six sets of such lines, and their relative arrangement forms certain included ornamental projections of definite character.

In the drawings, in which Figure 1 is an under side view of a "nappy" embodying the design, and Fig. 2 a sectional view, the several series of lines are designated 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, respectively. 1 and 2 are at right angles to

each other. 3 and 4 are similarly related, but are at an angle of ninety degrees with 1 and 2, while 5 and 6 intersect each other at right angles, but are at acute angles with 3 and 4.

The design is definitely a six-sided center piece, *a*, in small projections or facets, a series of Maltese crosses, *b*, having a "hobnail" pattern on their arms, and a series of conventional leaf-shaped figures, *c*, having diverging lines or veins *d* on their surface. The rest of the design is made up of prisms, triangles, and other resulting forms produced by the relative position and intersection of the several lines. The edge of the vessel is fluted and scalloped.

What I claim is—

The design for a dish or nappy, substantially as shown and described.
