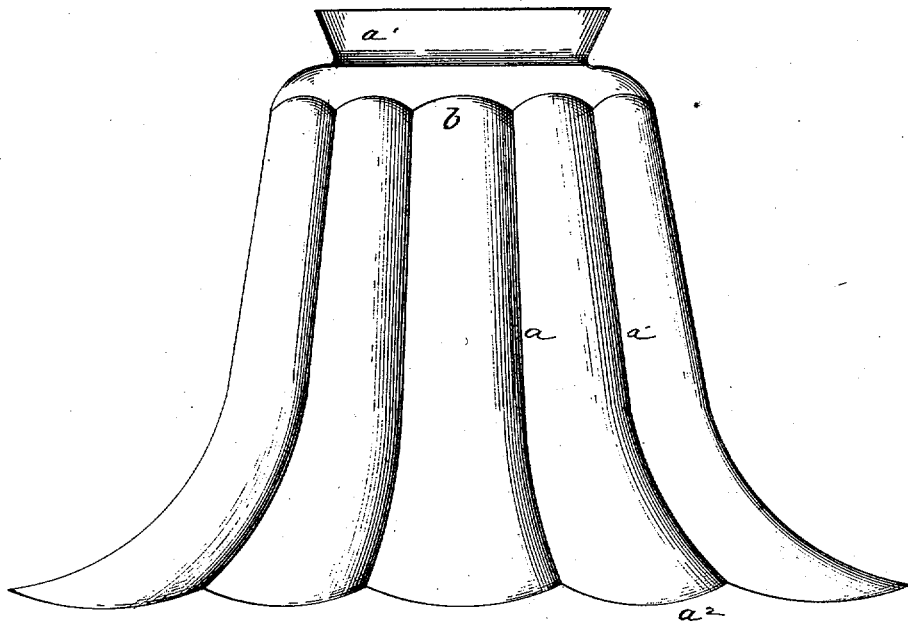

DESIGN FOR AN ELECTRIC-LIGHT SHADE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 19,279, dated August 20, 1889.

Application filed July 11, 1889. Serial No. 317,219. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH WEBB, a subject of the Queen of Great Britain, residing at Beaver, in the county of Beaver and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and useful Design for Electric-Light Shades; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form part of this specification.

My design for a glass shade or globe for electric-light fixtures consists of a bell-shaped globe or shade, having ridges *a a* extending from beneath the ring *A* to the bottom of the

globe, and having between said ridges the concave panels *b*, said ridges and panels terminating in a scalloped or fluted rim, the edges of the scalloped portions being rounded or concavo-convex, as shown.

What I claim is—

The design for a shade or globe herein shown and described.
