

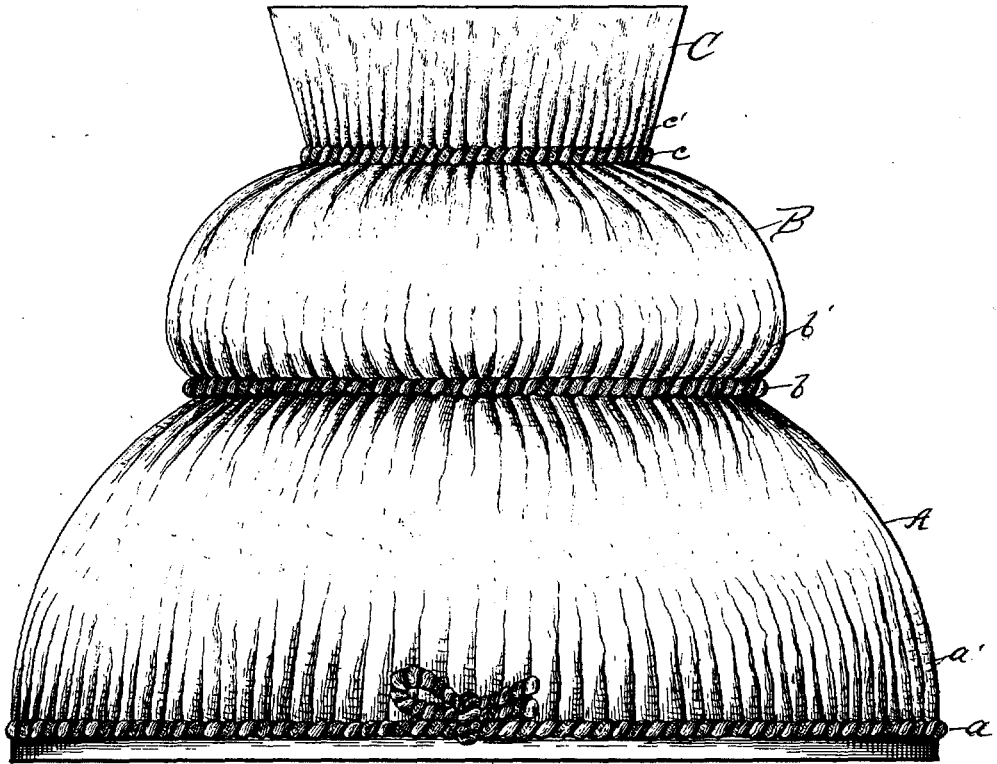

## DESIGN FOR A LAMP OR GAS SHADE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 19,395, dated October 29, 1889.

Application filed September 28, 1889. Serial No. 325,450. Term of patent 3½ years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JOSEPH WEBB, a subject of the Queen of Great Britain, residing at Beaver, in the county of Beaver and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and useful Design for Lamp or Gas Shades; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which forms part of this specification.

This invention has relation to designs for "lamp or gas dome shades;" and it consists of a glass shade representing a piece of silk or other fabric covering and tied with cords around or over a shade.

The shade, as shown in the drawing, is in the form of a large hemispherical section A, surmounted by a smaller section B, having a flared neck C, all provided with a conventional representation, as if covered with

silk tied with cords *a b c* around the mouth, the juncture of the two hemispheres, and the narrow portion of the neck, and crimped or folded in a characteristic way, as indicated at *a' b' c'*. The shade as thus formed is susceptible of fine decorative effects.

I claim—

The design for a shade, as shown and described, comprising the hemispherical upper portion B, dome-like lower portion A, and outwardly-flaring neck C, crimped and corded in conventional representation of a silk or other fabric covering.
