## DESIGN FOR A TABLE VESSEL OR DISH.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 17,664, dated August 23, 1887.

Application filed April 26, 1887. Serial No. 236,258. Term of patent 3½ years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JOSEPH WEBB, a subject of the Queen of Great Britain, residing at Phillipsburg, in the county of Beaver and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and useful Design for Glass Table Vessels or Dishes; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form part of this specification.

My invention has relation to designs for glass table vessels or dishes, and has for its object the provision of a new and pleasing exterior configuration and surface ornamentation applicable to the several articles which go to make a "set," as the sugar-bowl, cream-pitcher, spoon-holder, &c.

In the accompanying drawings, illustrating my design for table vessels or dishes, Figure 1 is a representation of a sugar-bowl, Fig. 2 is a representation of a cream-pitcher, and Fig. 3 a representation of a spoon-holder, each embodying my design.

The exterior configuration of each of these

articles is that of a truncated paraboloid, and the surface ornamentation consists of vertical ridges, pillars, or columns *a a a*. The articles are also further ornamented each with an annular flange, *b*, surrounding the mouth.

The leading feature of my design consists in the exterior configuration, which, as before said, is that of a truncated paraboloid and the ornamental ridges or pillars *a a a*.

I claim—

The design for a table vessel or dish herein shown and described, consisting of the exterior parabolical configuration surmounted by an annular flange, and the surface ornamentation consisting of the vertical ridges or pillars extending from top to bottom in an unbroken line and having rounded ends.
