DESIGN FOR GLASS DISH.

Specification forming part of Design No. **6,805**, dated August 19, 1873; application filed October 10, 1872.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN H. HOBBS, of Wheeling, in the county of Ohio and State of West Virginia, have invented a new and useful Design for Glass-Ware; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing making a part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of a glass dish illustrative of my improved design, and Fig. 2 is a vertical cross-section of the same.

Like letters of reference indicate like parts in each.

My improved design consists of an oval straight-sided dish. It is made oval—that is, longer than it is broad and with rounded ends. The bottom *a* is horizontal, or nearly so, on its upper surface, and the sides *b* form, to a horizontal plane passing through the bottom,

an angle more or less obtuse. These sides are made straight, and, in connection with the angle they make with a horizontal plane as above, are thereby distinguished from the concave form usually adopted in such dishes.

The bottom may be ornamented by pressing into it any desired figure; but the sides are made plain, smooth, and unground on both the inner and outer faces.

What I claim herein, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for glass-ware, shown and described.
