DESIGN FOR ORNAMENTING GLASS-WARE.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, J. H. HOBBS, of Wheeling, in the county of Ohio, and State of West Virginia, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Glass-Ware, of which the following is a specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawings, to which reference is made, Figure 1 being an elevation, and Figure 2, a sectional view on the line *x x* of fig. 1, which represents a sugar-bowl, which may be made of glass, or of hot-cast porcelain, and have a figure *in relief* produced upon it by the moulds in which it is formed, they having been previously prepared for that purpose.

The figure I have shown is a wreath or band of

vine, with leaves, tendrils, and fruit closely clustered, and so arranged that the vine shall form the upper part of the figure, and the leaves, tendrils, and fruit shall all be below the vine.

I claim, as my invention—

The design for glass-ware, as shown and described,
