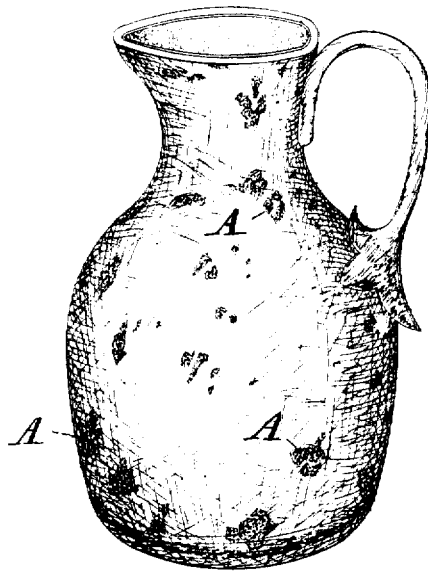

WILLIAM LEIGHTON, JR., OF WHEELING, WEST VIRGINIA.

DESIGN FOR GLASSWARE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 14,443, dated November 27, 1883.

Application filed September 28, 1883. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM LEIGHTON, JR., a citizen of the United States, residing at Wheeling, in the county of Ohio and State of
5 West Virginia, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Table, Bar, and Lamp Glassware, of which the following is a specification.

The accompanying drawing is a view in per-
10 spective of a piece of glassware embodying my design, the leading feature of which is an ornamentation composed of a series of spangles or flakes, A, which are incorporated in the body of
15 the glass between inner and outer layers thereof, so as to be visible through the latter, said spangles or flakes, while conforming in color or tint to the outer layer or layers, being prominently displayed and distinguished therefrom and from the background by the appearance

which they present. The spangles or flakes
20 A are of irregular shapes and sizes and are disposed irregularly; but the general effect of displayed spangles which is characteristic of my design will be preserved irrespective of the
25 irregularity or the uniformity of their size and disposition.

I claim—

The design for table, bar, and lamp glass-
ware herein shown and described, the same
30 consisting of an ornamentation formed by a series of spangles or flakes incorporated in the body of the glass.
