DESIGN FOR ORNAMENTING GLASS-WARE.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM LEIGHTON, Jr., of Wheeling, in the county of Ohio, and State of West Virginia, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Glass-Ware and hot-cast porcelain, of which the following is a specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawings, to which reference is herein made; and

It consists of a wreath or band of blackberries, leaves, and stems, intended to be placed upon the bowls of the various articles, or around the sides of

dishes or upon the covers of dishes, in any manner that shall appear most ornamental.

I claim as my invention—

The design for glass-ware or hot-cast porcelain, consisting of a wreath of blackberries, leaves, and stems, as shown.
