## DESIGN FOR THE ORNAMENTATION OF GLASSWARE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,995, dated November 23, 1886.

Application filed September 1, 1886. Serial No. 212,435. Term of patent 3½ years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, WILLIAM LEIGHTON, Jr., residing at Wheeling, in the county of Ohio and State of West Virginia, a citizen of the United States, have invented or discovered a certain new and original Design for the Ornamentation of Glassware, of which the following is a specification.

In the accompanying drawing, which makes part of this specification, the figure is a view in side elevation of an article of glassware having my improved design formed thereon.

In an application filed by me August 4, 1886, No. 210,023, I have described, shown, and claimed a design for the ornamentation of dishes and vessels, said design consisting, generally stated, of a shield or heart shaped figure, Maltese crosses, and fans.

The design herein for the ornamentation of dishes or vessels consists of a series of Maltese crosses, 1, arranged around the dish or vessel, said crosses being separated by angular ribs 2, and of a series of fans or fan-like figures, 3, around the upper edge of the ornamentation formed by the crosses 1 and ribs 2.

I claim herein as my design—

The design for the ornamentation of a dish or vessel, the same consisting of a series of Maltese crosses, angular ribs, and a series of fan-like figures, as described and shown.
